Spring seems to be here. Flowers are out! Gardens are in the works around town.





Coronado High School Robotics Team: Cougars Gone Wired By Gretchen Westphal

At Coronado High School, Cougars Gone Wired is the STEM (Science Technology Engineering Mathematics) focused FIRST (For the Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology) robotics team. They are a group of 9th-12th graders from District 11: Coronado High School, Palmer High School, and the surrounding areas. For the months leading up to their first robotics scrimmage, these students work diligently, meeting Monday through Friday, 4:30 PM – 9:00 PM and Saturdays from 9:30 AM to 4:00 PM. The Coronado Robotics Team is unique in that they build the only scrimmage arena in the state. Robotics teams from all around Colorado come to a Coronado-hosted scrimmage to test their robots for the first time. After the scrimmage, the students meet Wednesdays and Saturdays to fine tune their robots in anticipation for the main events, regional competitions.

This year, FIRST Robotics created a steampunk-themed competition, called Steamworks (https://www.firstinspires.org/robotics/frc/game-and-season). Each match is two minutes and 30 seconds long. In that time, teams form alliances and build up steam power for airships to take flight. Steam is built up in three ways: inserting fuel (wiffle balls) into the boiler; start rotors by delivering gears to pilots on the airship for installation; and prepare for flight by climbing a rope on each the alliance's airships. The Coronado robot utilizes all three strategies. (See www.team2996.com/steamworks.html for more details)

I was told about the opportunity to work with these students by Berni, our chapter president. I started volunteering my time three weeks before the first scrimmage and months after the building process had already begun. By this time, the group was already functioning as a well-oiled machine. Cougars Gone Wired is structured to resemble a business model and is split into sub-teams: business and technical, each headed by a vice president. The CEO oversees the completion of the robot, and the CFO corresponds with sponsors (potential and existing) and organizes fundraising events. It didn't take

long for me to be impressed by these students' work ethic, commitment, intelligence, creativity, and ingenuity. I wondered multiple times why I hadn't busied my 16-year-old self with an activity as stimulating as this one!
