

#### June 2021 Is Trench Safety Month

OSHA is collaborating with the National Utility Contractors Association and the North American Excavation Shoring Association for the sixth annual Trench Safety Stand Down Week, June 14-18, 2021. The stand-down raises awareness of the dangers of trenching and excavation and promotes the use of protective systems, such as sloping, shoring and shielding, through webinars, presentations, and individual company safety training. OSHA's trenching and excavation webpage provides additional information on trenching hazards and solutions, including a safety video.

#### **Keep Trenches Safe for Workers**

Trench collapses and cave-ins are a serious threat to workers, but they can be prevented. OSHA reminds employers that worker safety is a priority, and the agency has resources available to protect workers. The following safe work practices will help keep trenches safe for workers:

• **PREPARE a safe trench**. Provide safe entry and exit before starting work. Keep materials at least 2 feet away from the edge.

• **PROTECT workers from a cave-in by using protective systems.** Protective systems include *sloping* or benching trench walls, *shoring* trench wall with supports, *or shielding* trench walls with trench boxes.

• **INSPECT the trench for hazards.** Look for standing water and other environmental hazards. Never enter a trench unless it has been inspected and approved by the competent person.

For more information on common hazards, visit OSHA's Trenching and Excavation page. Employers can also take advantage of OSHA's On-Site Consultation Program, which offers no-cost and confidential occupational safety and health services to small- and medium-sized businesses. Consultation services are separate from enforcement, and do not result in penalties or citations. Contact the local OSHA area office for assistance.




