We received leadership training about NAWIC Orientation and the different Board positions for our chapters (President, Pres-Elect, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Directors). We also heard from two great speakers, Ryan Cessna of TESLA and Chad Housler of Granite Construction.

Ryan Cessna had some very informative stuff about TESLA as a company and their energy initiatives. Did you know that TESLA designs roof shingles? YES! And they train their installer partners to install energy efficient roofs that provide the home energy from the sun! That's right! Solar powered shingles!! Additionally, they are working on electric semi-trucks, reducing carbon emissions, and longer battery life for all their products. Extremely innovative!

Chad Housler, Area Manager for Granite Construction, shared how they are utilizing drone and GPS technology to improve site safety for excavating. Granite Construction has a heavy focus on excavation and earth moving in the heavy highway and mining sectors of construction. As you can imagine, they work in some pretty remote locations. Using drone technology and 3D modeling, they have literally saved their clients thousands of dollars in inaccuracies, slope corrections and time. Additionally, they have smart equipment that can upload the 3D model right to the excavation equipment! No more incorrect interpretations of a drawing! And no more human surveyors on site with these giant machines, eliminating safety challenges for the equipment operators and people on the ground. It's pretty amazing technology!

We received updates from our Regional Committee Chairs (NEF, PD&E, WIC Week and Safety). Be sure to check out their information in the PSW Region Newsletter that will be coming out soon! I'm super excited to be the Region PD&E Chair this year so check out the update in the Centerline! I'm also very excited to be entering the Holiday season. 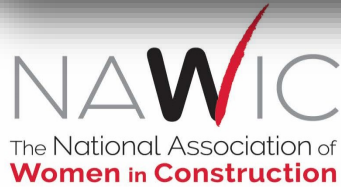

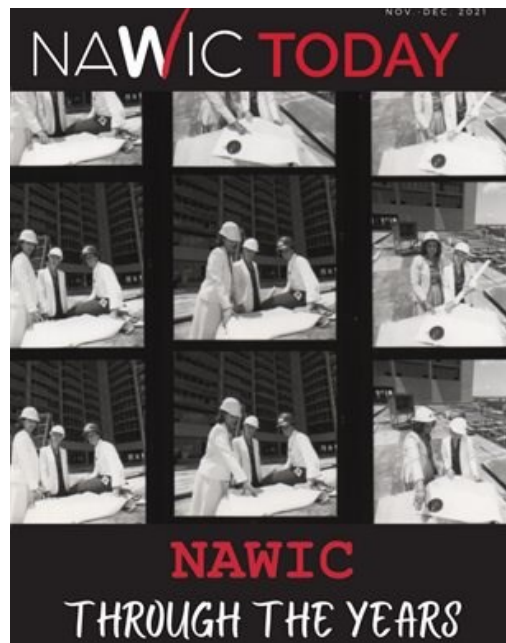
