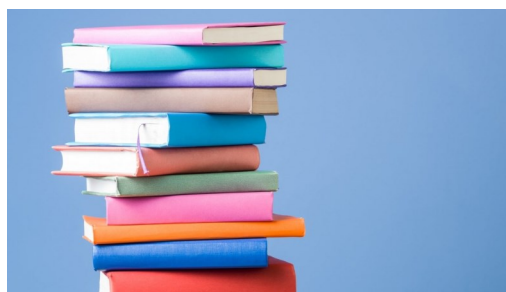

BIG HERO 6 MEETS CONSTRUCTION! A SAFETY CONSIDERATION

Nanotechnology has the potential to enhance basic construction materials such as cement, concrete, and steel. By adding nanoparticles, concrete can become stronger, more durable, self-healing, air-purifying, fire-resistant, easy to clean, and compact more quickly. Basic construction materials cement, concrete and steel will also benefit from nanotechnology. Addition of nanoparticles will lead to stronger, more durable, self-healing, air purifying, fire resistant, easy to clean and quick compacting concrete. Some of the nanoparticles that could be used for these features are nano silica (silica fume), nanostructured metals, carbon nanotubes (CNTs) and carbon nanofibers (CNFs).

Some examples of how nanotechnology is being used or has the potential to be used in the construction industry include self-healing concrete, energy-efficient buildings, smart windows and coatings, waterproofing, fire resistance, air purification, and nanofiber-reinforced concrete just to name a few. The addition of nanoparticles to concrete can significantly improve its strength and toughness, making it more suitable for use in high-stress construction applications.

Overall, the use of nanotechnology in the construction industry can lead to stronger, more durable, and more energy-efficient buildings, as well as improved safety and maintenance practices.



What are NANOMATERIALS?



Nanomaterials are very small, many times thinner than a **human hair**. A broad range of engineered nanomaterials are being added to hundreds of construction products.



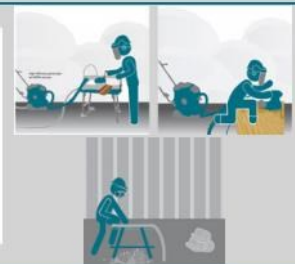

What do these materials have in common?

They may contain **engineered nanomaterials**.



When nano-enabled materials are cut, sanded or sprayed, the dust or mist can get in the air you breathe and into your lungs.



They can also get into cracks or cuts in your skin.

The National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) recommends limiting exposure.

Control Dust



Wet methods or use of a vacuum with a HEPA filter can reduce dust and exposure.

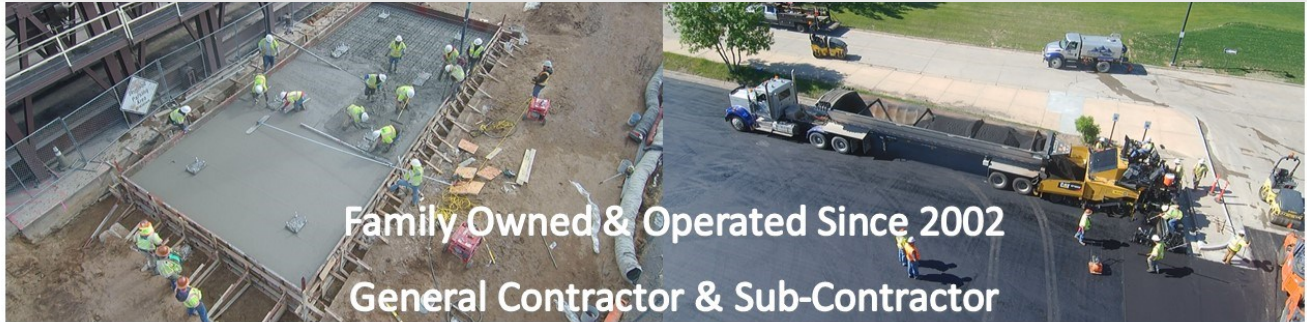

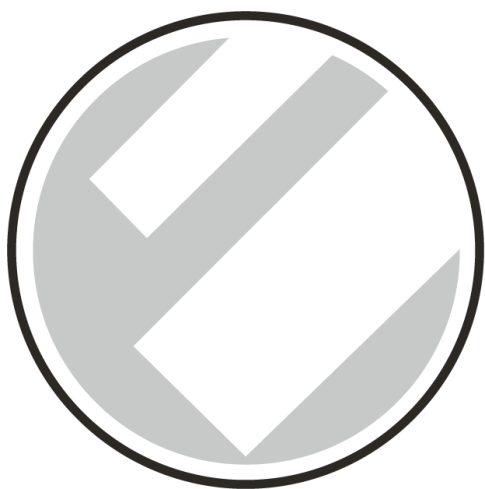
